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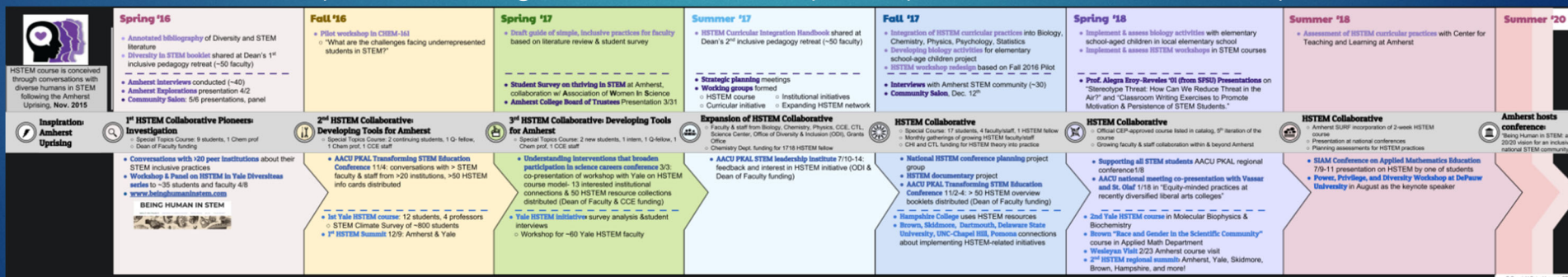




HSTEM

Being Human in STEM

- HSTEM is a student-designed course cofacilitated by students, staff, and faculty that helps participants collaboratively develop a framework to understand and navigate diverse identities and structural racism, and individually craft their own continuing HSTEM practice to combat racism and other forms of oppression at the individual and structural level in STEM and beyond on their campuses and future communities.
- The idea grew out of discussions between Dr. Sheila Jaswal, Associate Professor of Chemistry at Amherst College, and her students in November 2015 after a four-day sit-in where students discussed the pain and marginalization universally felt by students of color on campus.
